## GRAFTON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' MEETING 3855 Dartmouth College Hwy North Haverhill, NH 03774 April 22nd, 2014

PRESENT: Commissioners Michael Cryans, Martha Richards and Linda Lauer, Executive Director Julie Clough and Admin Assistant S. Norcross.

Commissioner Cryans called the meeting to order at 9:08AM.

ITM Ruggles arrived and gave the following report:

COA Deb Maes and Ken La Valley, Assistant Director of Programs from UNH arrived. K. La Valley introduced himself to the Commissioners. He handed out an informational packet that has the highlights of the Cooperative Extension in Grafton County and briefly discussed it with the Commissioners.

COA Deb Maes then gave the following report:

## Commissioner's Report for April, 2014. UNH Cooperative Extension, Grafton County Office

- ✓ Dave has been helping to coordinate the Professional Loggers Education Program this spring. The program is a cooperative effort between NH Timberland Owners Association, UNH Thomson School and UNHCE. Dave is on the NHTOA board of directors and the Timber Harvesting Council. This spring there are 20 workshops in 6 counties. Five of them are in Grafton County and one will be held on Grafton County property.
- ✓ Dave organized the recent Hunter Education April 10, 12, and 13 held at the Ammonoosuc Fish and Game Club in Bath.
- ✓ Two upcoming plant sales/deliveries are coming up through the State Forest Nursery and the Grafton County Conservation District.
- ✓ After a very cold winter that forced several plan revisions, Heather started the winter greens trial in the greenhouse in late March and is preparing a workshop series to go along with it in April and May. Once the greens trial is complete the greenhouse will be one site of a three-site tomato nutrient management study on campus, and in Maine.
- ✓ This past Saturday over 80 people attended a blueberry pruning and apple grafting workshop in North Haverhill.
- ✓ Deb has worked in three communities during the last several weeks, two of those in Grafton County. She helped plan two visioning sessions for the Friends of Livermore Falls group and continued to work with the committee to review the proceedings report and analyze the data to help the group's steering committee develop a set of action plans.
- ✓ Deb also worked with Charlie French and Molly Donovan during the recent Barrington Community Profile. Deb worked with the volunteer facilitators and scribes that were running the small break-out sessions during the event. More than 100 members of the Barrington community attended the two-day event.
- ✓ Deb has also begun working with the Bethlehem Broadband Readiness committee in Bethlehem and will serve as the local Extension contact for that group.
- ✓ Lisa is working at Lakeway Elementary School in Littleton using the Fresh Fruit & Vegetable Program. She has the students do a taste test of a new fruit and vegetable and provide the students with materials to bring home to parents.

- ✓ Lisa also started a Cooking Matters for Parents class beginning Thursday, April 3 at Whole Village in Plymouth. This program is supported by the NH Food Bank.
- ✓ Kathy Jablonski is updating curriculum materials that are used statewide in 4-H Club and Afterschool programs and working with a team to develop a new afterschool healthy living curriculum.
- ✓ She continues to work with the North Country Health Consortium on planning the June 27<sup>th</sup> Health Summit. She is focusing on community based practices to increase healthy living choices.
- ✓ Kathy is also working on developing and providing healthy living trainings for the statewide professional development network (ACROSS NH), 4-H leaders and afterschool program providers.
- ✓ It's been a busy season for our 4H participants and their leaders. A two-day Fashion and Textile Event (quilts, garments, stuffed animals and purses) was held in Woodsville with a total of 52 members participating in the event. This event wouldn't have been possible without the help of 26 volunteers who helped organize the event, judged and were all around helpers. In addition 15 local sponsors supported the event with donations of gifts and prizes.
- ✓ Donna and her team of event superintendents are already getting organized for this year's North Haverhill which showcases the year's efforts of the 4-H youth from around the county.
- ✓ Michal took advantage of the pre-growing season for agriculture/livestock producers to organize a number of workshops across the state including; Dairy Conferences in Concord, Whitefield; a Livestock Producers Working with Slaughterhouses session also in Concord; 3 Winter Forage Workshops in Lancaster and Concord. He also provided four risk management trainings for Future Farmers of America groups at their schools and at their state wide convention.

## **Budget Review**

ED Clough gave the Commissioners the up to date Revenue Comparison from FY14 and FY15. She said that if they were to bond both Nursing Home projects there would be no affect in this fiscal year.

They discussed how much would need to be cut in order to get the amount to be raised by taxes to under 3%.

Supt. Oakes arrived with his recommendation for the diesel fuel bids. He stated that he spoke with someone from both Dead River and Irving. Irving cannot provide a fixed rate only a variable and Supt. Oakes did not recommend going with a variable rate. He stated that he recommended the Commissioners go with Dead River's fixed bid of \$3.6385/gallon.

Commissioner Lauer moved to accept Dead River's bid of \$3.6385/gallon. Commissioner Richards seconded the motion and all were in favor.

ED Clough stated that she received a call from Ty Gagne and was asked to be a panelist for the Leadership NH Group on State and Local Government day. It will be held May 7<sup>th</sup> at the Plymouth Town Hall.
